2. Discussion Methods

- \neg Give direction before the discussion
- \neg Carry out discussions in accordance with the rules of the game that have been set
- \neg Give each participant an equal opportunity to give their ideas and opinions.

Endalikan Control the discussion of the subject matter being discussed

3. Demonstration Method

Demonstration Method is a way of presenting lessons by demonstrating or showing students a particular process, situation, or object being studied, both actual and artificial, which is often accompanied by oral explanations.¹²

a. Advantages of Demonstration Method

- b. Weaknesses Demonstration Method

- ¬ Not all objects can be demonstrated

 \neg Material will be difficult to understand if education does not adequately master what is considered.

1. Learning Ethics
